

Northwest Boundary Tunnel Project: Benefits Bill Levy

- Over 11 billion gallons captured to date
- Over 6,911 tons of trash, debris, and other solids captured
- Exceeding predicted capture rate (90%>80%)
- First year in operation was the wettest year on record for the District of Columbia



- Reduce the frequency and magnitude of street flooding
- Significantly mitigate the frequency, magnitude, and duration of sewer flooding and basement backups in the Northeast Boundary drainage area
- Reduce risks to human health
- Control *combined sewer overflow (CSO)
 discharges to the Anacostia River, significantly
 improving water quality
- Prevent deterioration of historic resources from water damage caused by flooding

Responses to Recent Concerns Andy Galli

CONCERN	RESPONSE		
A resident near the R Street NW site expressed concern that the construction lights are being left on late into the evening when no work appears to be taking place. Can the lights be switched off after construction hours?	DC Water's contractor will turn off the unnecessary lighting on-site-after 7 pm to manage a balance between nuisance lighting and worker safety.		
DC Water & Contractor vehicles blocking access to the alley behind R street.	The Resident Engineer at the R Street Construction Site reminded workers that vehicles should not be blocking alley access.		
What are the NEBT parking restrictions or changes? What about parking with Residential Parking Permits Only & Street Cleaning day?	NEBT construction has limited and prohibited parking in some areas around its construction sites and are identified with signage. Residential Parking Permits are established by the Department of Motor Vehicles. Street Cleaning is carried out and the responsibility of the Department of Public Works.		
A concrete truck was parked in front of a resident's house in the early morning hours.	The on-site inspector immediately spoke to the driver to make sure he was aware of the project-required haul routes.		
A utility contractor parked his vehicle on the sidewalk at the intersection of NJ Ave and Warner Street NW in Shaw.	We checked into the location of the incident and neither DC Water's NEBT or other DC Water project is working on New Jersey Avenue NW.		
The storm drains overflows every time it rains. Trash and other debris are preventing the flow of rainwater.	An inspector investigated this matter and cleared the drain.		
There are large trash dumpsters that are overflowing in the parking lot that your construction site occupies.	The large trash dumpsters have been removed.		
During construction at First Street NW and Thomas Street NW, the existing DDOT No Parking Signs were temporarily removed. Can they be restored?	The contractor is working to restore the DDOT No Parking signs on Thomas Street NW.




First Street Pumping Station Construction Site: Work Overview Gianluca Pianezze

Current Activities: Restored intersection of First Street and Rhode Island Avenue NW. Installed instruments to measure soil movement, vibrations and ground water.

Next Activities: Begin the NEBT connector liner in Fall 2021.

Later: Dismantle and remove the First Street Tunnel TBM and connect the NEBT to the First Street Tunnel in Spring 2022. Demolition of the pump station in the Spring to Summer of 2023.




Portions of the First Street Tunnel Boring Machine left in place.

A cross section view of the First Street Connector Tunnel






The distance between the NEBT and the First Street Tunnel TBM is closer than appears in the image.

T Street NW Construction Site: Work Overview Gianluca Pianezze

Current Activities: Lining the interior of the drop shaft with concrete. Excavating the approach channel, junction chamber, and storm drains on T Street.

Next Activities: Pour the concrete walls and base of the approach chamber. Excavate the adit connecting the drop shaft to the tunnel.


Later: Construction site will be repositioned to the south side of Rhode Island Avenue NW to build new inlets in early 2022. First phase of work includes installing secant piles.




T Street NW and First Street NW Construction Sites: Traffic Pattern Matt Wolniak

T STREET NW CONSTRUCTION SITE - Pedestrian Detour

MAIN IMPACT:

At T Street NW the crosswalk is closed at the westbound side of Rhode Island Avenue NW. All crosswalks at First Street are open. Pedestrians, please follow the detour signs.




Florida Avenue NW Construction Site: Work Overview **Gianluca Pianezze**

Current Activities: Completing the lining of the drop shaft. Installing the concrete internal structures for the approach channel and diversion sewer.

Next Activities: Begin ground freeze and adit excavation. September 2021 to 2022. Turn on freezing plant to run 24 hours; a noise reducing wall has been installed. After hour work underground begins later this fall continues into 2022.

Later: Complete construction of the Approach Channel and shaft internal structures. Site restoration.











MAIN IMPACT:

East crosswalk open at Rhode Island Avenue NW at 3rd Street NW. Crosswalk closed at Florida Avenue NW between 3rd Street and 4th Street. **Pedestrians**, **please follow the detour signs**.





R Street NW Construction Site: Work Overview Gianluca Pianezze

Current Activities: Pour the base slab and begin constructing walls and internal structures for the diversion chamber and approach channel.

Next Activities: Construct the power distribution control vault and related structures. These facilities house the ventilation fan and sensor relays to monitor the NEBT and transmit information to Blue Plains.


Later: Restore the site area and park.

MAIN IMPACT:

Reduction and shifting of travel lanes on 6th Street. One lane closure on Rhode Island Ave NW eastbound. R Street NW westbound traffic is detoured. **Bike lane remains open through R Street NW.**





MAIN IMPACT:

Crosswalk closed at Rhode Island Avenue NW and 6th Street NW intersections and on 6th Street and R Street NW intersection. **Pedestrians**, please follow the detour signs.



NEBT Claims Process Hadiah Jordan

- If you are a property owner and you believe that construction activities undertaken as a result of this project have damaged your property in some way, you may send an email to dccleanrivers@dcwater.com or call the Hotline at 800-988-6151.
- A representative of the contractor, SIH, will contact you to receive the information for the claim. A claim will be initiated on your behalf and a copy will be transmitted to you. Further communications about the claim will occur between the property owner and DC Water's insurance company.
- The claim receives a claim number, and an adjuster investigates.
- It is recommended that when you see damage, report it.




